You won't want to miss this very informative conference about important subjects presented by experts who have been speaking and writing about these topics for many years. Special thanks to Gloria Pruyne, Chairman and her great planning committee for the many months of preparation that has gone into the state conference.

Here are the outstanding speakers and their topics:

Patrick Wood is the author of several books on the subject of Technocracy, which he believes is now coming into full swing. The technocrats believe they are the superior ones who should be ruling the world. Patrick has a great website called "Technocracy

News and Trends."- His topics are: "AI, Technocracy" and "Transhumanism." Here are some questions he will answer: What is meant by technocracy and who devised it back in the 1930s? Another deceptive name for it is "sustainability." Who are the technocrats of today and what are their goals for controlling the world? How and why do they want to transform mankind into transhumans; how is that happening; what purpose will that serve?

Tom DeWeese is the head of the American Policy Center and the author of several books. He is well known as a valiant defender of property rights especially against the globalist efforts to destroy them through UN Agenda 21/ now 2030. DeWeese is the one who first taught us what the UN term "sustainability" really means: "This is a stick up- give me your property." It is all about taking away property rights. His topics will be: "Property Rights and Zoning Protections" and "The Real ID and Digital Identity." He will answer such questions as: Why are property rights God-given? What happens to people when their property rights no longer exist or are honored? What is happening to zoning protections? What is the real purpose of the Real-ID? Can you still say no to it? What is digital identity, what happens to a nation when digital identity is totally in place?

The Keynote Speaker and MC will be Alex Newman: He has been a speaker for several of our Eagle Forum state conferences. He is also an author and an expert on education and home schooling which he and his wife do for their six children. He is a journalist who speaks several languages and writes for many publications: his own Liberty Sentinel, the Epoch Times and he is the Senior Editor of the New American Magazine. His topic is "Financial Freedom vs CBDC."

Some questions he will answer are: 1) What exactly is CBDC and who are those behind it? What will it mean for each of us personally if we no longer can use cash, or currency or checks—only credit cards? What will CBDC do to our personal freedoms—will we become like China where everything they do is governed by their social credit score shown on their credit cards? Will CBDC have something to do with the fulfillment of what Revelations says about not being able to buy or sell without a certain mark? Rev. 13:16-18.

Smart Cities and Fifteen Minute Cities Near You: Orlean Koehle, the CEO for EFCA and also an author, has been asked to speak at the conference on the research she has been doing on “Smart Cities (SCs)” and “Fifteen Minute Cities (FMCs).” Why are cities readily making all the modern technological changes to be designated as a SC? Could it be because they are awarded with much money, grants and recognition. It is like a competition. And if they win—it is a badge of honor?

The residents are told they will have “a better quality of life,” but is that really true? According to Catherine Austin Fitts, an expert on the financial part of SCs, she believes another name for smart is “spy.” All of these Smart Cities will be capable of spying on their residents at all times. The ultimate goal is not only to have all technology in the cities connected together through the “Internet of Things (IoT)” but also connected to the “Internet of Bodies (IoB.)” The evil, designing people behind these SCs want people to also be connected to things as well through chips placed inside the human body—that is what a transhuman person will be.

Some of the questions Orlean will answer are: How far along are SCs in the USA and in the rest of the world? What is behind them pushing them? And a big question—how do cities get so quickly rebuilt, modernized and eligible to be called “smart cities” after a “natural disaster?” Were they maybe not natural disasters at all—but planned “land grabs?”

Notice at the bottom of the picture of the LA Smart City is written in tiny letters “December 2020.” So 5 years before the horrible LA fires of January 2025 that destroyed close to 17,000 homes, it was already planned for that area to be a Smart City. With so much of it now destroyed and the debris cleared away, how much easier it will be to rebuild it and modernize it—just in time for the 2028 Olympics? Is that also why so much of the land has been declared off limits—not able to be rebuilt—set aside as a “buffer zone?”

Is that also what happened to Lahaina, Maui, that was also planned to be a Smart City ten years before the devastating fires of 2023 that destroyed 2,000 of its mostly older homes? Was this also a planned “land grab” fire? Is that also why so much of the beach front property has been declared not rebuildable—that its shoreline is too unstable?

To be declared a smart city, “green” high tech standards must be met: smart grid, smart meters, modern smart LED street lights, lots of 5G antennas, smart infrastructure, but also constant smart surveillance.



Seven Top Smart Cities in the USA: These cities were chosen out of 100 because of their advanced technologies. They are: **New York City** which has smart grids in place, free Wi-Fi for all citizens, open data that promotes transparency (using facial recognition). **San Francisco** has bike-sharing, parking sensors, smart bins—the garbage bins have a sensor that signals when the bin is filled up; **Seattle** has clean energy, EV charging, digital equity—“all are equal in the digital realm;” **Boston** has smart lighting, free Wi-Fi, innovation labs; **Chicago** has IoT traffic, predictive policing, citizen engagement and long-term resilience;” **Denver** has smart mobility infrastructure, EV expansion, “climate-focused digital governance,” and, downtown **Los Angeles** has already achieved the Smart City status with adaptive traffic control, smart streetlights, and “large-scale sustainability initiatives.” Of course, cameras are everywhere. That is what “smart” streetlights mean—cameras are attached.

Fifteen-Minute Cities: City leaders receive even more awards and money if they can establish areas inside their cities as designated “Fifteen-minute Cities (FMCs),” meaning that many high-rise apartment buildings are being built especially close to where shopping malls are. Many of these are what is known as **mixed use**—with the ground floor as a shop or business and living quarters up above.

If the FMC is complete and eligible for awards, it will be built around shopping areas where all shopping, schooling, recreation, even work can be done within 15 minutes from where the people live so they can walk or ride a bike or sometimes have public transportation. Some driverless EVs will be allowed to transport people. But gas-driven cars are not allowed, and little by little, they will be phased out. The excuse behind all of these changes moving us to Smart Cities and FMCs is about **climate change and achieving zero net emissions by a certain date.**

Smart Cities and FMCs are all about control: When all people have digital IDs and CBDC is in full swing, we will only be able to use credit cards for purchases. That is when our lives will be under total control. Let us try to postpone that day as long as possible, by only using cash and checks.

CALA and CFC—Stay Informed and Up to Date on California Legislation:

There are two groups now that we can go to for help to navigate our way through the massive amount of bills presented in every legislative session. The new “kid on the block” is called **“CALA, California Action for Legislation Accountability.**

There is no charge for joining, but when you do and let them know who your legislator is for both the Assembly and the Senate, then CALA will keep track of your legislator and inform you when a bill is going to appear before the committee that your legislator sits on. They also give you guidance on what the bill is about and what to write or call in with a phone call to oppose or support the bill giving the conservative viewpoint. (Sorry to say, in this whacky state, 98% of the positions on the bills are to oppose them.)

CFC—California Family Council:

As a pro-family, pro-life organization, Eagle Forum of California has mainly worked with this CFC for the majority of legislation dealing with life and family issues that we are most concerned about. EFCA is a member of the coalition and recently - March 16, we had a table at the “March for Life” rally at the State Capitol hosted by CFC.

“Watch Dog:” CFC is making access to their list of bills more user friendly under the title of “Watch Dog.” All the bills of concern will be available in one list. Articles written about them explaining CFC’s position on them will be shown with a link to them.

There is a section on how to write a letter showing sample letters, how to submit a letter, as well as a link to track how the state legislators voted on each bill of concern. The bills are also able to be found according to their issues. For example, all “parental rights” bills are listed together.

We thank both CALA and CFC for helping to make the legislative process as user friendly as possible for us in our state.

Education—Continued Victories for Parental Rights by the Supreme Court: Last June 25, in the decision in *Mahmoud v Taylor* 606 US, SCOTUS reaffirmed parents’ constitutional right to direct their children’s religious upbringing and education. The court ruled that parental rights are violated whenever government policies interfere with religious beliefs and practices. In this case, it was centered around the Montgomery Board of Education—in Montgomery, Alabama. They were allowing exclusive LGBTQ books into the curriculum, while withholding any notice to parents and forbidding any optouts.

Now on March 2, 2026, in SCOTUS’ latest ruling in *Mirabelli v. Bonta* 607 US, the court cited *Mahmoud*, saying that what was going on in school policy keeping secrets from parents in regards to their child’s gender transitioning was a much greater violation of their parental rights than secret indoctrination into LGBTQ storybooks.

The school district violated the “free exercise clause” of the 1st Amendment and the longstanding rights of parents to direct the upbringing and education of their children. SCOTUS further ruled that parents who have had their rights violated have grounds to sue the school district.

SCOTUS further cited the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA), and warned that school districts that violate this **are subject to losing their federal funding.** The PPRA further instructs parents of their right to inspect all the curriculum that is being used, including teacher’s manuals, films, tapes, and any surveys or questionnaires used on their children. Parents must first give their written consent before a school may use such. And the school must be willing to accept and honor all optouts.

Help Save Girls’ Sports in California: The CIF, California Interscholastic Federation, currently allows males to compete in girls’ sports- a policy that undermines fairness, endangers safety, and violates the core principles of Title IX. While CIF may claim it is simply following state law, this is no excuse for ignoring federal mandates. Under the Supremacy Clause of the U.S. Constitution, **federal law—including Title IX—supersedes conflicting state laws.** Both California and CIF are legally obligated to comply with federal law, and failure to do so constitutes a violation of that higher authority. CFC has drafted a **public letter to CIF** calling on them to revise their Gender Identity Participation policy (Bylaw 300 D), adopt a **biological sex-based standard**, and protect female athletes under Title IX. **Go to Californiafamily.org to sign the petition.**



Five Ways “King” Gavin Newsom’s Policies Are Driving California Into Crisis— by Lauran Hull, Editor

For generations, California symbolized opportunity. Entrepreneurs launched world-changing companies here. Farmers produced food for the nation. Families moved west in search of a better life. But today, many Californians are asking a

different question: **What happened to the Golden State? And Many are moving away in droves.**

Here are five major policy trends critics say are pushing California in the wrong direction.

1. Government Expands While Private Jobs Decline: A healthy economy depends on a strong private sector that creates jobs, investment, and opportunity. Yet in California, the opposite trend is emerging.

According to California’s nonpartisan Legislative Analyst’s Office, since September 2022 the state has lost roughly 154,000 private-sector jobs, while public-sector employment has grown by about 361,000 positions.

That means the government is growing rapidly even as private businesses struggle. At the same time, job openings across California have declined significantly. Data from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics shows that job openings dropped from about 920,000 in August 2023 to roughly 641,000 in August 2024.

California’s unemployment rate has also climbed to 5.3 percent, higher than the national average. Critics say this shift reflects policies that make it increasingly difficult for businesses to operate and expand in California.

2. Businesses are Being Driven Out of the State: California once attracted companies from around the world. Today, that is not the case, and businesses are choosing to leave. High taxes, strict regulations, and rising costs have pushed companies to relocate to states like Texas, Arizona, Tennessee, and Florida.

In recent years, hundreds of corporate headquarters have moved out of California, taking jobs and investment with them. When businesses leave, the impact goes far beyond company executives. Workers lose opportunities, communities lose economic activity, and the state loses tax revenue.

Critics argue that instead of addressing the policies driving businesses away, Newsom continues to increase regulations and mandates that make it harder to operate here.

3. Gas Prices are the Highest in the Nation: California drivers pay the highest gasoline prices in the USA—often by a wide margin. According to AAA, the national average for gasoline is typically around \$2.60 to \$2.70 per gallon, while Californians frequently pay **\$4.50 per gallon or more**, with prices exceeding **\$5 in many counties**.

Governor Newsom has blamed oil companies for “price gouging,” but critics point to state energy policies that limit gasoline supply. Environmental regulations, refinery restrictions, and limits on drilling have made California’s fuel market uniquely expensive. When supply is restricted, prices rise—and drivers are left paying the difference. For many families already struggling with housing and food costs, higher gas prices make everyday life even more expensive.

4. Restricting Water While Farmers Struggle: Water policy has become another flashpoint. California’s State Water Resources Control Board has proposed additional conservation rules under a program called “Making Conservation a California Way of Life.” These regulations impose further limits on water use for homes, businesses, and local communities. Yet urban water use accounts for only a small portion of the state’s total water consumption—about 4 to 5 percent. Agriculture accounts for about 15 percent, while the majority of water is reserved for environmental uses. Critics argue that instead of building new reservoirs and improving water storage infrastructure, the state continues to rely on restrictions that hurt farmers and communities—like the recent destruction of three Klamath River dams..

Without new water infrastructure, farmers are often forced to leave fields unplanted during drought years—even when heavy rains occur in other seasons.

5. Agriculture and Small Businesses are Burdened with Enormous Costs: California remains the largest agricultural producer in the United States, generating more than \$51 billion in farm revenue annually, according to the California Department of Food and Agriculture. The state produces many of the fruits, nuts, and vegetables that feed the nation. But farmers are facing increasing pressure from water limits, environmental regulations, and rising labor costs.

One example is the new **\$20 per hour minimum wage for fast-food workers**, the highest in the country. Supporters say it helps workers keep up with California’s cost of living, but critics warn that policies like this increase prices, reduce hiring, and push small businesses to automate or close. For farmers and small business owners already dealing with high taxes and regulatory costs, each new mandate adds another layer of financial strain.

California at a Crossroads: Despite these challenges, California remains one of the largest and most dynamic economies in the world. Its innovation, natural resources, and entrepreneurial spirit are unmatched. But critics of Governor Newsom’s policies believe the state is heading in a dangerous direction.

Expanding government while private jobs shrink, driving businesses away, restricting energy and water, and increasing the cost of doing business are weakening the economic foundation that once made California thrive and built its prosperity.

For many Californians, the solution is simple: After 15 1/2 years of non-stop progressive, leftist governors like King Newsom, it is time to elect a conservative Republican governor, before we totally lose our Golden State.

EIPCA Voter Roll Discrepancy Challenge: We are so appreciative of having Linda Price and Ruth Weiss now as members of our state board and are grateful for all of their hard work and dedication over the past 15 years to try to restore honest elections for our state. This is the report that Linda Price, EIP's founder gave for our last state board meeting, March 15th.

Election Integrity Project California (EIPCA) is filing a new writ of mandate through Ruth Weiss as the lead petitioner, challenging the Secretary of State's handling of voter rolls. She detailed findings of discrepancies in the 2022 election, including 43,624 more votes than were certified, and ongoing issues with voter roll management favoring Democratic seats. Linda mentioned that EIPCA's data team identified over 100,000 changes in voter rolls post-certification, and the organization is reaching out to Attorney General Pam Bondi and the Department of Homeland Security to investigate these discrepancies. She also shared that a California State Treasurer candidate was impressed with EIPCA's documented evidence and expressed interest in promoting it. Linda also told of a constitutional case that was dismissed by a corrupt California judge despite having Ninth Circuit standing.

Voter ID will be on the November 2026 Ballot: Thanks to all of our Eagles who helped gather signatures for the Voter ID petition. It has received way over the million signatures needed to qualify it for the ballot. Just be aware of the sneaky language it will be written in to confuse people so they won't know which way to vote on the ballot measure.

Is HAARP for Real? The High Frequency Active Auroral Research Program is real. It is not a Conspiracy theory. A close friend Richard Tashjian, an electrical engineer, was there on assignment in Alaska to check it out and make sure it was functioning properly. He brought pictures and showed them to us. HAARP was honored in August of 2007 by DARPA at a DARPA Tech Conference (according to WIRED Magazine, written 8/13/2007.) They would not honor something that was fictitious. .

What is HAARP? It is a series of high antenna towers located near Gakona, Alaska, that send out powerful electromagnetic waves into the ionosphere. Many people have never heard of DARPA or HAARP, so they are clueless as to what this is all about. DARPA stands for Defense Advanced Research Project Agency. It is the military's research and development branch.

Here is what WIRED Magazine wrote when HAARP received its award. "HAARP...is either an ionosphere-boiling superweapon, a giant mind control facility, a pork project *par excellence*, or some kind of defense against nukes in space. But no matter what the project does, one thing is clear: DARPA, ...absolutely loves it...At DARPA-Tech conference, HAARP's main contractor was first on the list to receive an award from the agency."

However, the one use for HAARP that this quote from WIRED leaves out—is what many Americans (including myself) find most worrisome. We believe HAARP is used for **weather modification**. In fact when Dr. Bernard Eastlund, the creator and designer of HAARP, was asked that very question, "Does HAARP have The ability to alter the weather, he answered, "Well, technically yes, but the government would never let that happen." How many of us believe that is the case—the government would not allow any harm to come to its citizens?

How Can HAARP be Used to Alter the Weather? It works in conjunction with specially equipped planes that have been spraying aerosol, minute, metal particles in the upper atmosphere. By directing HAARPS ELF waves at these particles, they can be heated to more than 100 °F and prevent the accumulation of water vapor that would otherwise form clouds and produce rainfall. HAARP can then lift and move those particles somewhere else, thus leaving drought-like conditions in one spot but causing enormous rain, storms, hail, hurricanes, tsunamis, etc. in other areas.
